a. **Penalties for Violations –** these penalties will apply for each violation of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations whether the violation is detected by law enforcement, the VAN LINE or otherwise.

*In addition to the penalties listed above, van operators who are determined to be unable and/or unwilling to comply with the federal safety rules or company policy may be disqualified from van line service at any time. The Progressive Discipline Program is in addition to any other fines, penalties or corrective actions that may be imposed on van operators under the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations or on the associated hauling agent under van line policy, including any fines or penalties set forth in Bulletin HHGS-09-03 and MTI-1555 (Policy Violation Sanctions)

a. **Van Operators.** All fines, assessments and deductions imposed on drivers provided by CONTRACTOR will be charged to CONTRACTOR.

b. Notices

i. **Notification of Suspensions, Cancellations of License.** Any van operator who receives notice that the van operator's Commercial Motor Vehicle license has been suspended, revoked or cancelled must notify the VAN LINE Safety Department by the end of the day the day after the van operator receives that notice. Failure to do so may result in penalties up to and including disqualification of the van operator.

ii. Notice of Out of Service at Roadside Inspections – Any driver who is placed out-of-service at a roadside inspection must provide notice to the VAN LINE's Safety department according to the type of violation within the time limit set forth below:

A. Unsafe Driving - notice must be provided to the VAN LINE's Safety department within 24 hours.

B. <u>Hours of Service (including log violations)</u> – notice must be provided <u>immediately</u> to the VAN LINE's Safety department and the VAN LINE's Safety department must be consulted before the driver returns to duty.

C. <u>Driver Fitness (CDL violations and medical examination card violations)</u> – notice must be provided to the VAN LINE's Safety department within 24 hours.

D. <u>Controlled Substances and Alcohol</u> - notice must be provided <u>immediately</u> to the VAN LINE's Safety Department and the VAN LINE's Safety department must be consulted before the driver returns to duty.

E. <u>Vehicle Maintenance</u> - notice must be provided to the VAN LINE's Safety department within 24 hours.

F. Hazardous Materials - notice must be provided to the VAN LINE's Safety department within 24 hours.

c. **Motor Vehicle Reports**. Where permitted by law, VAN LINE'S Safety department will obtain monthly motor vehicle reports on CONTRACTOR.
